Having to ask where something is is so difficult because I can't hear the person explaining where to go so I can find what I'm looking for. Many times, I end up leaving without things I need. Wearing masks also effect my family. My husband has major hearing damage from his time in the military and needs to see people's mouths to understand what they're saying. My daughter has anxiety and asthma, and those are both made worse by wearing a mask. When she feels like she can't breathe fully, get anxiety goes up. When her anxiety goes up, she feels like she can't breathe. From there, it gets worse until she's having a panic attack. Please don't turn this into a law. It doesn't work, it's not good for individuals, and it's not good for us as a community. I grew up here, and it was so nice going out and smoking at people, getting smiles back, having chitchat with strangers in stores or feeling a little more free to go up to someone to ask a question. It's not like that anymore. Prime barely acknowledge each other with a head nod. No more friendly chat as we pass by each other in the stores. People are more closed off
