Categories of Unserved Definitions


- Category 1: Contiguous areas where no infrastructure exists capable of delivering broadband
- Category 2: Isolated pockets and roads that don't have broadband infrastructure that are located within otherwise-served areas
- Category 3: Locations at the end of long setbacks/driveways requiring customers to contribute to the cost of installation of the "service drop"

FY 22 Network Infrastructure Grant Program Update

- Connect Maryland program through the Office of Statewide Broadband
- Funding available to address Category 1 and Category 2 areas
- Applications submitted in January 2022
 - County partnered with ThinkBig Networks and Comcast
- Awards recently announced

FY 22 Network Infrastructure Grant ThinkBig

- North Nanjemoy area
- Category 1
- Value of the award \$884,631
- Approximate number of properties to be served - 350
- Requires a 30% match from the County
- The cost of long driveways is included in the grant



FY 22 Network Infrastructure Grant Comcast

- Dentsville/Charlotte Hall area
- Category 1 and Category 2
- Value of the award \$9,664,808
- Approximate number of properties to be served 996
- Requires a 1% match from the County
 - Comcast is matching 17% of the grant
- The cost of long driveways is included in the grant



FY 22 Network Infrastructure Grant Next Steps

- Work out remaining financial details
 - Budget transfers for County's match
- County staff will negotiate and execute Memoranda of Understanding (MOU) with Comcast and ThinkBig Networks
- State and each provider must also execute a Grant Agreement



Overall Progress to Date

- CTC Technology & Energy prepared a Broadband Strategic Plan for the County, which was presented to the Commissioners in early 2020.
- As outlined in this report, CTC identified the approximate number of unserved properties throughout the County:

Category	Unserved Properties (est)
1	2,300
2	1,000
3	1,500
TOTAL:	4,800



Potential Projects State Grant for Category 3

- ► The State will be releasing another grant program in July/August that will provide funding for long driveways (Category 3)
- ► The County has a program in process to identify Category 3 properties and the funding amount needed to serve
 - ▶ 112 responses received
 - Subcommittee of the Task Force is working on the award criteria
- More to come need to weigh what we can do now versus what the State may be able to provide


Build Progress - Maps

Easements

- The County continues to encourage residents to grant ThinkBig an easement (where needed), so that ThinkBig may bury the broadband fiber underground.
- Burying fiber underground is preferred over pole installation due to:
 - Faster installation, and
 - Better protection for the fiber requiring less maintenance and resulting in less down time.
- ThinkBig has received 119 easements in Nanjemoy and 48 easements in Cobb Neck to date.



NBE-Cat2 Project Update

- Waverly Point build was completed in March 2022
- Serenity Woods build was completed in June 2022
- County staff meets with Comcast bi-weekly to get updates on the neighborhood builds.
