Congratulations on your victory in the Primary.

On behalf of Walton Global, a real estate asset management company owning 500 acres of land in the Newburg area, we strongly oppose the Newburg Septic Tier Map Change from Tier 2 to Tier 4 and ask that you vote NO to this change.

As we and many stakeholders testified at the County Commissioner hearing on May 25, 2022, a sewer downgrade decision made before approving the proposed Newburg Sub-Area Plan would prevent a comprehensive and conclusive process. The most reasonable procedure for receiving diverse stakeholder input and appropriately planning for smart economic development in this important gateway to Charles County and the State of Maryland is through the Sub-Area Planning process. As we know the Planning Commission voted

and recommended this approach.
