National Crime Victims' Rights Week

WHEREAS, with the full support of their community and victim service providers, survivors will feel empowered to face their grief, loss, fear, anger, and shame, without fear of judgment and will feel understood and worthy of support; and

WHEREAS, National Crime Victims' Rights Week, April 23-29, 2023 presents an opportunity to commit to ensuring that all victims of crime, even those who are challenging to reach or serve, are offered culturally and linguistically accessible and appropriate services in the aftermath of crime; and

WHEREAS, the Charles County Center for Abused Persons (CAP) is dedicated to building partnerships with trusted sources of support, including community leaders, religious groups, schools, and other agencies to better reach and serve all victims of crime, no matter their community; and

WHEREAS, this year's theme, "Survivor Voices: Elevate, Engage, Effect, Change" calls upon communities to amplify the voices of survivors and crate environments where survivors have the confidence that they will be heard, believed and supported.
