Update: 2020 Maryland General Assembly Legislative Session

Ms. Danielle Mitchell, Associate County Attorney, Office of the County Attorney, provided an update on the following Bills:

- 1. HB387 Tri-County Council for Southern Maryland Funding was favorable.
- 2. HB482 Southern Maryland-Homeowners Association Commission-Alternative Dispute Resolution Authority- was favorable.
- 3. SB4 Gaming Sports Betting Implementation-Amendment for Exception for Riverboat was supported.

Ms. Mitchell informed the Commissioners on the House Bond Bills and explained that this was for their information only and that no position letters are needed at this time. These were:

- American Legion Post 170- Repairs, Safer Facility for three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000.00).
- CSM, Velocity Center- for two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00).
