# Charles County Health Department Update: Coronavirus/COVID-19

Dr. Dianna Abney, Health Officer, Charles County Department of Health; Ms. Michelle Lilly, Director, Department of Emergency Services; Mr. William Grimes, Vice President, Ancillary Services & Incident Commander, Ms. Stacey Cook, Vice President, Human Resources, Dr. Joseph Moser, Chief Medical Officer, University of Maryland Charles Regional Medical Center, provided an update on COVID-19 statistics and how they are responding to COVID-19. Ms. Lilly discussed coordinating with Charles Regional Medical Center on the location of the decontamination station. She also informed the Commissioners that the First Responders vaccine clinics are scheduled for the next two (2) weeks. Dr. Abney indicated that they are expecting an increase in COVID positive over the next several weeks due to the holiday gatherings. She explained the difference between isolation and quarantine; task of contact tracers; and information on the vaccine and the vaccination phases. Mr. Grimes explained the difficulty of finding temporary staffing not only here but across the country. He also mentioned that over four hundred and twenty (420) staff members have received the first dose of the vaccine to date.

Ms. Jennifer Harris, Chief of Media Services, Office of the County Administrator, provided an update on the ongoing media communications, the Vaccine Distribution Public Awareness Campaign and vaccine communications plan.

The department also discussed housing preservation programs for low-income families; homeownership programs to build financial stability and facilitate equitable access aimed at reducing the wealth gap; various community development initiatives; and a preview of new service initiatives planned for 2021.
