#### Call to Order/Pledge

Commissioner Collins called the meeting to order, and Commissioner Bowling led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### Roll Call

A roll call was taken. All the Commissioners were present.

#### Comments

A motion was made by Commissioner Bowling, seconded by Commissioner Rucci and passed, with all Commissioners present, voting in favor to make today (July 13, 2021) a legislative day.

Commissioner Collins acknowledged the service of the Senior Center Board that dissolved and thanked them for their service.

#### Charles County Health Department Update: Coronavirus/COVID-19

Dr. Dianna Abney, Health Officer, Charles County Department of Health; Ms. Michelle Lilly, Director, Department of Emergency Services, provided an update on COVID-19 statistics and how they are responding to COVID-19.

Dr. Abney reviewed the multiple vaccination clinics, pop-up clinics, and the mobile vaccines within the community that are being held indoors and drive through. She stated that that they are downsizing the vaccination schedule since less people are getting vaccinated at this time. She reviewed the concerns related to the Delta variant and explained that the vaccination for COVID-19 will work against the Delta variant if fully vaccinated. She also reviewed COVID cases by age, Charles County COVID deaths by month from March 2020-July 2021. She indicated that all COVID numbers are down.

Ms. Lilly informed the Commissioners that the Department of Emergency Services (DES) ended SitReps on July 1, 2021. She mentioned that the Governor's reinstatement of the state of Emergency on July 12, 2021, was only administrative in nature to ensure certain funding. DES will continue to monitor COVID and provide support as needed.

Ms. Jennifer Harris, Chief of Media Services, Office of the County Administrator, reviewed the latest GoVax commercial featuring Mayor Brandon Paulin which promotes vaccines for young adults. Media will also promote school vaccinations at all summer meals site to help increase the vaccination rate for students ages twelve (12) to seventeen (17). She also discussed the NBC4 segment for the GoVax campaign.

Mr. Jason Stoddard, Director of Safety, Charles County Public Schools, joined the discussion to update the Commissioners. He discussed summer school and COVID-19 festing and staff will continue updating their COVID-19 protocols this summer and for the 2021-22 school year which begins on August 30, 2021.

#### Update and Request to Approve: Community Stormwater Management Priorities

Ms. Deborah Hall, Deputy County Administrator, Ms. Deborah Carpenter, Director, Department of Planning and Growth Management, and Ms. Jenifer Ellin, Director, Department of Fiscal and

Administrative Services, provided an update and outline of the proposed approach to address community stormwater management priorities. Staff and the Charles County Resilience Authority are working to resolve issues with private stormwater systems which would ordinarily be the responsibility of the landowner. To initiate the concept and get an idea of the scale of the problem, staff identified about one hundred (100) neighborhoods that pre-date the stormwater ordinance, with private stormwater systems that had known problems as determined by consistent complaints of flooding and had no county-owned easements or maintenance agreements.

The Commissioners agreed to the prioritization method presented.

A motion was made by Commissioner Bowling, seconded by Commissioner Rucei and passed, with all Commissioners present, voting in favor to allow the Resilience Authority to act as project lead and procurement entity.

#### Briefing: Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program - Emergency Response Routes

Ms. Donna Daugherty, Engineer III, Ms. Cathy Thompson, Planning Supervisor, Department of Planning and Growth Management; Mr. Stephen Staples, Chief of County Roads, Department of Public Works; and Sgt. Juan Morales, Traffic Operations Supervisor, Charles County Sheriff's Office, provided a presentation on the Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program. The Traffic Safety Committee recommended to make no changes to the Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program eligibility criteria regarding emergency response routes at this time.

## Follow Up Work Session: Bill 2021-02 Zoning Text Amendment (ZTA) 19-154 Single-Family Attached Residential & Multi-Family

Mr. Kirby Blass, Planner III, and Mr. Jim Campbell, Planning Director, and Mr. Charles Rice, Assistant Planning Director, Department of Planning and Growth Management, reviewed the staff report. Based upon comments and feedback received during the Public Hearing, and the subsequent open record period, staff has weighed the merits of those collective recommendations in the context of the intended purpose of these amendments and has endeavored to refine the proposed text accordingly for the County Commissioners' consideration. Notable refinements discussed involve - transitional provisions, color schemes and material selections, garage doors, end wall and rear wall detailing specifications, rooflines, and setbacks between buildings.

The Commissioners directed staff to come back on July 27, 2021, for another work session to address concerns related to reducing the existing masonry percentage, the fire retardancy of proposed alternate materials, environmental ratings, the future maintenance/ durability of proposed alternate materials, and any impacts on property values. They also requested pictures of the proposed materials.
