Ms. Alexis Blackwell, Director, Department of Human Resources; and Mr. David Johnson, Vice President, Bolton USA, provided an overview of the Maryland Time to Care Legislation that establishes a paid family and medical leave insurance program to which employers, employees, and self-employed individuals will make contributions. It provides up to twelve (12) weeks of paid leave to care for oneself or a qualifying family member. They reviewed the effective date, coverage, description of "family member," how much is paid; and the cost. The options to meet this new required insurance plan are: 1. default into the State plan; 2. self-administer alternative plan; 3. Contract out alternative plan. Mr. Johnson reviewed the Time to Care Act Collaborative option and benefits.
