- I. Committee Chair Amy Blessinger welcomed the members and asked them to introduce themselves.
- II. Ms. Blessinger announced that the county had exceeded our 2010 final self-response rate of 71.5%. As of August 16, the county's self-response rate was 71.9%.
- III. Lee Osberry, Census Bureau Partnership Specialist, presented updates from the Census Bureau:
  - He announced a new end date for Census response of September 30.
  - He discussed Non-Response Follow Up operations (Door to door Census takers).

- The Bureau continues to request outreach at events and locations for Mobile Questionnaire Assistance Centers (M-QACs).
- Mr. Osberry presented the current overall self-response rate for the county, and also the Census Tracts with the lowest self-response rates. He discussed that these are the areas the committee needs to focus outreach efforts on.
- IV. John Watson, Maryland Census Office, provided Census updates from the state and encouraged continued outreach, particularly to the lowest responding areas.
- V. Ms. Blessinger discussed a Call to Action for a final outreach push to the lowest responding areas:
  - She encouraged the members to promote the Census at their upcoming events including drive-thru and virtual events. She said it would be especially helpful to have Census survey assistance at these events.
  - She provided a list of county businesses and food pantries and encouraged members to conduct outreach at these locations.
  - She invited members to request promotional materials (flyers, buttons, business cards, yard signs, etc.) to assist with outreach.
